 - Events Text and photos
 - Projects Text and photo
 - Important Dates & Deadlines
 - Information on Meetings of District Judges and Landscape Consultants
 - District Newsletter original format and /or PDF
 - Highlighting a speaker for the District Meeting
- 2. Your information should be positive, upbeat and action oriented
- 3. Include a descriptive article, photos, etc., and a separate registration form.
- 4. All text MUST be emailed
- 5. Any photo of youth, there must be a VFGC Media Release form signed by the Youth's parents. This should be on the VFGC website under forms.
