# **CLUB NEWS:**

AMELIA COUNTY GC MEMORIAL GARDEN: COMMUNITY SERVICE, EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH & MEMBERSHIP EFFORTS. By Jean Tremaine

Amelia County Garden Club takes its role seriously as a resource for everyone. Their primary service/outreach project is a permanent Memorial Garden that is both a sanctuary and educational venue for residents.

The club gives ad-hoc guided tours of the Garden to donors, students, garden clubs and non-profits. And they hold an annual sale of divisions of plants from the Garden. Members answer questions year-round from visitors, at sales and from published articles.

ACGC recognizes that the Garden is a showcase of cultivars that thrive locally. They fulfilled a long-term goal of community action through education when they invested in dozens of professionally printed permanent labels for mainstay plants.

Now visitors can walk the paths and identify specimens of interest. ACGC encourages county residents to visit often for inspiration.

ACGC publishes 30+ articles annually in the local newspaper about plants/activities to keep the club and Garden top of mind and to encourage new members. Articles always reference when plants can be found in the Garden to encourage visits. Labeled plants make it simple to locate/replicate something visitors admire. Articles always include club contacts for more information.

ACGC maintains the Memorial Garden 24/7/365. Though they have fewer than 25 members, they do most of the upkeep themselves. Even during months they do not meet, members lovingly tend the Garden and publish articles.

Inevitably, some things are outsourced...such as a new pergola to sit upon that replaced an earlier version.



ACGC is grateful the Garden appeals to all ages. Prom, Mother's Day and wedding photos are taken there. Nearby rehab facility residents visit. Students & Scouts come to learn about plants. Office workers lunch there, enjoying the serenity.

And happily, the Garden is a certified Monarch Way Station making it a refuge for pollinators, as well.



Laurie Fox is a faculty member in the Horticulture department at Virginia Tech and is based at the Hampton Roads Agricultural Research & Extension Center in Virginia Beach, VA where she has extension and research responsibilities. She received her BS & MS degrees in Horticulture from North Carolina State University, with an emphasis on landscape design, ornamental plant production, and weed science, and her Ph.D. from Wageningen University, The Netherlands. Laurie is an author and the publisher of *Best Plants for Hampton Roads - A Landscape and Garden Companion*.

### **Peggy Singlemann**

Peggy Singlemann is nationally known as one of the foremost gardening experts. Her experience in the field is exceeded only by her infectious enthusiasm in sharing knowledge of best practices. She is a familiar figure as the longtime host and coproducer of Virginia's only gardening TV show, *Virginia Home Grown*, on Virginia Public Media/PBS. In 2022, the Virginia General Assembly presented a commendation to Peggy for her outstanding guidance, restoration, and preservation of Maymont's gardens, grounds, and arboretum over 38 years of service.
