GENERAL INFORMATION

- **1. AWARDS YEAR:** January 1 to December 31 annually. A continuing project may include a small amount of history on the project for background, but the majority of the application is to be about work accomplished during the current calendar year. It should be stated clearly anything that is not done during this period.
- **2. DEADLINE:** The deadline for submitting award applications to District Awards Chairman is **DECEMBER 1**, unless otherwise stated. Applications for ALL awards (including VFGC, SAR and NGC) will be judged by the District Awards Committee, unless otherwise stated. District winners will be sent via email or surface mail with tracking to the VFGC Awards Chairman (Heidi Sage, 1057 Jacks Shop Rd., Rochelle, VA 22738, hbsage@aol.com) by **DECEMBER 15** to compete for VFGC, SAR and NGC awards.
- **3. ELIGIBILITY:** Only VFGC members are eligible to apply for VFGC awards unless otherwise stated in the award description. Members are: member garden clubs, groups of member clubs, and individual members of garden clubs. Junior, Intermediate, and High School Garden Clubs. Individual Youth must be sponsored by a member garden club to be eligible for specific VFGC, SAR and NGC awards.

4. APPLYING FOR AWARDS - CLUB AWARDS CHAIRMEN

- Application forms are available on the VFGC website (www.virginiagardenclubs.org, click on Awards) <u>Current Application form is required</u>. No password is required for the awards info.
- There is a 3 page limit plus the **current VFGC/NGC cover sheet**; using only the front of the pages. Exceptions noted.
- When a single project is eligible for more than one award, submitting an exact duplication of the application is not acceptable. A significant change must be evident in the summary regarding the project.
- Binders and vinyl sheet protectors are not allowed. Exceptions noted.
- Applications will not be returned.

- Applications may be submitted electronically or by hardcopy. If submitting a hardcopy, include THREE complete copies of the award application. Keep a fourth copy for your records.
- Use Times New Roman Font, no smaller than size 10, 12 is preferred.
- Flower Show Achievement Awards, Publicity Press Books, and Member Award of Honor do NOT use the VFGC award application. For more information see VFGC List of Awards or VFGC website (www.virginiagardenclubs.org, click on Awards).

5. APPLYING FOR AWARDS - DISTRICT AWARDS CHAIRMEN

- First place winners in each category must be sent by mail or e-mail to the VFGC Award Chairman (Heidi Sage, 1057 Jacks Shop Rd., Rochelle, VA. 22738, hbsage@aol.com, 540-948-3778) by December 15. Exceptions noted in VFGC List of Awards.
- A complete list of award applications from your district must be included with submissions. List is to include VFGC award number, VFGC award name, and submitting club name for each award application.
- When submitting award applications by mail, send three copies. Retain a fourth copy for your records.
- 6. CATEGORIES BY CLUB SIZE: Some awards specify awards according to club size. Club size is determined by the <u>number of members as of December 1st for whom VFGC dues are paid</u>, including Active, Associate, Inactive, Honorary, etc.

- **7. BOOK OF EVIDENCE:** A Book of Evidence is required when applying for the following awards:
 - a) Flower Show Achievement Awards see NGC web site for requirements
 - b) Publicity Press Book no limit on number of pages
 - c) Member Award of Honor not to exceed 5 pages, one sided

For additional information on Member of Honor award, see the NGC website Awards Handbook pg. 43 (www.gardenclub.org) and/or VFGC website (www.virginiagardenclubs.org, click on Awards).

8. SCALE OF POINTS: All awards are judged by a "Point Scoring Rubric". Judging with a Scale of Points allows all clubs to know how their application will be judged before submitting it. It also assures that all applications are judged on the same criteria in a fair and impartial manner. The Point Scoring Rubrics for all VFGC awards can be found on the VFGC website (www.virginiagardenclubs.org, click on Awards) and are also found on the NGC website. Where there are specific point score rubrics, they are indicated in red for those award categories.

VFGC SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

SP-1 FLOWER SHOWS – three awards will be offered for shows staged through Dec. 1 of 2024.

\$25 may be awarded to a club in each size group (small, medium and large) in the following three categories. It may be any type of NGC flower show presented by a single club. Complete the VFGC cover sheet/application form and simply attach a page with the requested information.

- a. For the clubs who are having their first ever flower show. The date the club was founded will be considered. (small, medium, large).
- b. For the clubs who have gone the longest since having a flower show (small, medium, large)
- c. For the clubs who have the most new participants exhibiting in their club's flower show. (small, medium, large)
- **SP-2 "PLANT AMERICA, FEED AMERICA"** \$25 may be awarded to a club in each size group (small, medium and large) For members who grow their own vegetables, fruit or other produce and donate to a local food bank or any other organization that helps fight food insecurity. Complete the VFGC cover sheet/application form and attach a page showing the total weight of produce donated for the period ending Dec. 1, 2024.
- **SP-3 TREX FILM RECYCLING CHALLENGE** \$50 will be offered each year to the overall winner, regardless of club size, who collects the most pounds of recyclable plastic film. Complete the VFGC cover sheet/ application form and attach a page with the total weight you have collected each calendar year ending Dec. 1st. Submit this by Dec. 1st to the district award chairman, who will forward it to the state awards chairman.

DISTRICT AWARDS

S-5 BLUE STAR MEMORIAL LANDSCAPING

\$20 may be awarded to a **district** for the most outstanding Blue Star Memorial landscaping projects (Highway Marker, Byway Marker, or Memorial Marker). The marker and landscaping may be part of a highway department rest area maintained by the department. The project may have been continuous, but major landscaping must be completed within two years. The project may be a replacement of a destroyed or long neglected landscape. (SAR #14, NGC # CE-7, (2) for district)

S-6 CLUB MEMBERSHIP WITHIN DISTRICTS

\$20 may be awarded to the **district** bringing in the greatest percentage of new members into VFGC between February 1 of the preceding year and the end of January of the current year. The VFGC Treasurer will use the number of dues paying members to determine the district with the highest percentage increase and confer with the VFGC Membership Chairman before submitting the name of the winning district to the Awards Chairman by February 15. No application required.

S-7 DISTRICT FLOWER SHOW SCHEDULE

\$20 may be awarded to a **district** for the clearest, most accurate, specific and comprehensive flower show schedule for a standard flower show. **(SAR 24 B)**

A. Districts 900 members and under

B. Districts over 900 members

The scale of points for Flower Show Schedules can be found on the VFGC Awards webpage or on pages 135 – 138 of the on line NGC Flower show handbook. Attach copy of the flower show schedule as provided to judges, to the award cover sheet/application.

S-8 DISTRICT NEWSLETTER

\$20 may be awarded to a district in each category publishing the best newsletter (NGC # MAE 4 A through D; see NGC point score rubric, on VFGC website or NGC handbook pg. 39)

A. Districts 900 members and under B. Districts over 900 members New as of summer 2023 – submit only one edition by email. Include cover sheet/application and answer all questions on point score rubric on a separate page.

S-9 SMOKEY BEAR/WOODSY OWL POSTERS

\$20 may be awarded to a **district** with the greatest number of posters (percentage based on district membership). Information submitted to VFGC Awards Chairman by VFGC Smokey Bear/Woodsy Owl Poster Chairman, by March 15. No award application required.

S-10 WEBSITE for DISTRICTS

\$20 may be awarded to a **district** for the most outstanding website promoting the sponsoring organization and NGC objectives. Give website address, who maintains site, how often updated, etc. **(SAR #21, NGC # MAE -2 A through D)** The NGC point score rubric for Websites can be found on the VFGC Awards web page or in the VFGC website or NGC Awards Handbook pg. 35 on the NGC website.

S-11 PENNY PINES AND PLANT A TREE COMBINED

\$20 may be awarded to a <u>district</u> donating the most money to Penny Pines and Plant a Tree programs combined in the calendar year.

Clubs report their total donations to the District Penny Pines Chairman, who then reports totals for each district to the State Penny Pines Chairman, who then informs the VFGC Awards Chairman. No application form/cover sheet needed, just club name, size and total money.

S-12 VFGC LIFE MEMBERSHIP

\$20 may be awarded to a **district** with the most new VFGC Life Memberships (percentage increase based on district membership) between March 1 of the preceding year and the end of February of the award year. VFGC Life Membership Chairman should report to the VFGC Awards Chairman by March 15. No application required.

CLUB AWARDS

S-14 ARBOR DAY, TREE PLANTING ACTIVITIES

\$20 may be awarded to a club (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for The most outstanding tree planting activity and/or promotion of conservation and preservation of trees and/or Arbor Day activities. Emphasis on native trees. (SAR #1, possibly NGC #EC-5)

S-15 BIRD, BUTTERFLY, WILDLIFE SURVIVAL

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for conducting the most comprehensive and effective project for pollinator, bird, or wildlife protection and welfare. This may include habitats or gardens specific to the natural population being supported, sanctuaries, migratory routes, public education project or program, legal and legislative activities or other. (SAR # 2 or3, or possibly SAR SP 1, NGC #EC-3 see VFGC website or NGC Awards Handbook pg 20 for point score rubric)

S-16 ORGANIC GARDENING PRACTICES

\$20 may be awarded to the **club** (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding project emphasizing and employing the use of organic materials and methods in a gardening project or educational activity. **(NGC # EC-6)**

S-17 CONSERVATION

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for conservation activities, education or legislative activity; conservation field project; natural resource development, such as a watershed, erosion control, reforestation, wildlife refuge; overall excellence and well-balanced year's conservation activities.

(SAR # 5, NGC # EC-1 or EC-2)

S-18 WATER

\$20 May be awarded to a club (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding project with an emphasis on water conservation and/or clean water. (*SAR # 15, NGC # EC-4*)

S-19 LITTER/RECYCLING/RECLAMATION

- a. \$20 may be awarded to a club (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding community project on litter prevention, reclamation and/or recycling, e.g. yearlong program, organizing recycling program, establishing community composting site. (SAR # 17)
- **b.** \$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for the most complete promotions of **Chucky Chipmunk** and the "STOP Throwing and START Stowing" anti-litter theme: i.e. poster contest, newsletter, school program.

S-20 FOOD BANK DONATIONS (new 2021)

\$20 may be awarded to a club (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for donating the largest amount of freshly grown food to a food bank, pantry or other organization providing food to those in need in a community. May involve others; community, government agencies, youth, facility residents. Etc. Provide verification from the recipient of quantity received.

See VFGC website or NGC Awards Handbook pg 14 for point score rubric (NGC # CE-3)

S-21 FLORAL DESIGN PROGRAM (new 2021)

\$20 may be awarded to a club (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding program or workshop teaching floral design to club members and/or the public. Three single sided page limit (plus cover sheet) applies. (SAR # 20 A or B; See VFGC website or NGC Awards Handbook pg. 23 for point score rubric (NGC # FD-2)

S-22 CIVIC PROJECTS WITH NATIVE PLANTS

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for establishing wildflower gardens, memorial gardens, or the restoration of historic gardens with emphasis on native plant material to our region. (possibly SAR # SP 2; NGC #CE-6)

S-23 RECLAIMING UN-USABLE SPACES

\$20 may be awarded to a club (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding project in reclaiming an un-usable space. It must be an area that has not been used in the past (an empty lot, an area that has become "a dumping spot, etc...). The project photos must reflect a definite change in the use and look of the space. Please include before and after photos and details of work and location.

S-24 CIVIC BEAUTIFICATION/CIVIC ACHIEVEMENT

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for a distinguished civic or conservation work making <u>permanent</u> improvements for public benefit, e.g. establishing sanctuaries, experimental forests, municipal gardens, landscaping public buildings, etc. No commercial project is eligible. (**SAR #4; NGC # CE-5**)

S-25 BLUE STAR MEMORIAL LANDSCAPING

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding Blue Star Memorial landscaping projects (highway marker, byway marker, memorial marker). The marker and landscaping may be part of a highway department rest area maintained by the department. The project may have been continuous, but major landscaping must be completed within two years. The project may be a replacement of a destroyed or long neglected landscape. **(SAR #14, NGC # CE 7)**

S-26 COMMUNITY LANDSCAPE DESIGN

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding project/significant contribution in planning and planting for: commercial property, church or synagogue, hospital, library, civic center, park, waterfront, etc. Copy of landscape plan must be included in application. (SAR #4, NGC # CE-8)

S-27 ROADSIDE BEAUTIFICATION

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for outstanding, permanent roadside beautification. The program may be continuous, but must have advanced degree of completion prior to making application. Project may be done in stages. **(SAR #11, possibly NGC-# CE-4 A or B or CE-5 A or B)**

S-28 PLANT TOGETHER COMMUNITY GARDEN PROJECT

\$20 may be awarded to the **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) having the most outstanding Plant Together project. These projects may involve community clean up, planting a new area, container gardening, or other projects designed to spark an interest in gardening. All projects **must** involve partnering with other groups in your community. (**NGC # CE-1 A,B,C or D**)

S-29 HISTORIC PRESERVATION

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for a historic preservation landscaping project such as the restoration of a park, a building, and/or garden of importance to local, state, or national heritage. (SAR #8, NGC #CE-9 A or B)

S-30 DECORATION OF HISTORIC BUILDING

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for decorating a historic building/house/mansion. Decorations are not required to be of the period of the building, but should be creative, distinctive, and harmonize with the building's style. Designer's choice of all materials within purview of curator, official, or owner of the building. (NGC #CE-5)

S-31 HORTICULTURE THERAPY

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for an outstanding program working with the physically or learning challenged in nursing homes, schools, prisons, etc.

S-32 HORTICULTURE THERAPY GARDEN PROJECT

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small; ii medium; iii large; iv two or more clubs) for establishment of a garden/s to benefit the physically or learning challenged, residents in nursing homes, schools, prisons, low income housing, Habitat for Humanity, etc. Includes barrier-free garden, accessible gardening, community garden, meditation garden at hospital, etc. **(SAR # 6 or7, NGC # G-3)**

S-33 MEMBERSHIP

\$20 may be awarded to the club (i small; ii medium; iii large) with the highest percentage of new members (percentage increase based on dues paid between Feb. 1 of the previous year to Jan. 31 of the current year. No list of new members is required. No application is required. The State Treasurer will furnish the names of the clubs with the highest percentage increases for each size group to the state membership chairman. The name of the winning club in each size group will be sent to the VFGC Awards Chairman by Feb. 15.

S-34 NATIONAL GARDEN WEEK

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the best overall promotion of National Garden Week. Entry to show community awareness throughout the entire week and may include local and/or state proclamations. **(SAR #10; NGC # MAE 5)**

S-35 PENNY PINES AND PLANT A TREE COMBINED

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club) with the most money donated to Penny Pines and Plant a Tree programs combined in the calendar year. Clubs report total dollars donated to the District Penny Pines Chairman, who reports to the State Penny Pines Chairman who then informs the VFGC Awards Chairman.

No application form/cover sheet is needed; just club name, size, and total money donated. (SAR # 9)

.S-36 VISION OF BEAUTY CALENDAR SALES

\$20 may be awarded to the **club** selling the largest number of VISION OF BEAUTY calendars. Clubs need to supply the number of members and the number of calendars sold as evidence. A. Based on total calendars sold B. Based on calendars per member

S-37 SMOKEY BEAR/WOODSY OWL POSTERS

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** with the greatest number of posters submitted to Youth Poster District Chairman. VFGC Smokey Bear/Woodsy Owl Chairman will report results to VFGC Awards Chairman by March 15. No application required.

S-38 YOUTH ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the most outstanding project in the field of environmental education involving youth. **(SAR # Y - 1, NGC # YW 9)**

S-39 YOUTH HORTICULTURE EDUCATION

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the best promotion of gardening among youth; based on belief that youth should be educated to become future horticulturists. **(SAR #Y- 1, NGC # YW 8)**

S-40 GARDENING FOR WILDLIFE EDUCATION AWARD (new 2020)

\$20 may be awarded to a club (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) for the most notable project or projects educating the public on the benefits of gardening for wildlife. Extra points will be given for originality and new ideas. Include the number of members in the club, the percentage of members participating, the approximate number of people educated and how they were notified of the project. Club may partner with youth groups like scouts. (NGC # EC 3 or G-4 for establishing a public wildlife garden with signage) Please see VFGC website or NGC Awards Handbook pg 20 or 30 for point score rubric.

S-41 POLLINATOR GARDENS WITH YOUTH

\$20 may be awarded to the **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club; iv two or more clubs) with the best project of planting pollinator gardens while educating youth. These gardens may be container gardens. Gardens may be in public or private locations. (**SAR # Y -1, NGC # YW 9**)

CLUB AWARDS - PUBLICATIONS AND PROMOTION

S-42 PUBLICATIONS

\$20 may be awarded to a A. club (i small club; ii medium club, iii large club)

B. Group of clubs (councils or districts, etc.)

for the entry judged best in each category 1-8. Notices or flyers for one time events are not eligible. Printed publications or those prepared for electronic distribution are acceptable entries.

(NGC # MAE 4 E,F, and G please see VFGC website or NGC Awards Handbook pg 39 for point score rubric) NGC no longer judges cookbooks or calendars.

- 3. Clubs with 30-44 members
- 4. Clubs with 45-69 members
- 5. Clubs with 70-99 members
- 6. Clubs with 100-299 members

S-46 FLOWER SHOW SCHEDULE – TWO OR MORE CLUBS

\$20 may be awarded to **two or more clubs** or **a council** for the clearest, most accurate, specific and comprehensive flower show schedule for any type of NGC flower show. *(SAR #24B)*The scale of points for Flower Show Schedules can be found on the VFGC Awards webpage or on NGC web site. Attach copy of the flower show schedule as given to the judges to cover sheet/award application.

S-47 WEBSITE

\$20 may be awarded to a **club** (i small club; ii medium club; iii large club) for the most outstanding website promoting the sponsoring organization and NGC objectives. Complete cover sheet/application and attach one page with your website address, who maintains site, how often updated, and cost. Ease of navigation will be considered while judging from the current site. **(SAR #21, NGC # MAE 2)** Scale of Points for Websites can be found on the VFGC Awards webpage or on the **NGC Awards Handbook pg 35**.

S-48 PUBLICITY PRESS BOOKS

A pink rosette may be awarded to winning books of evidence exhibiting quality, quantity and diversity of coverage in the print media promoting garden clubs and NGC goals and objectives. Prepare a Book of Evidence. No limit on number of pages. Complete the coversheet/application and attach to the inside front cover. Book must be sent to VFGC Awards Chairman (Heidi Sage, 1057 Jacks Shop Rd., Rochelle, VA 22738 hbsage@aol.com (540) 948-3778). DEADLINE: JANUARY 15 (SAR #23)

MEMBER AWARD OF HONOR

Member Award of Honor Certificates may be awarded to one member in each district whose volunteer efforts during a period of five or more years, has made outstanding contributions to club and community, in one or more of the following areas: civic development, horticulture therapy, youth activities, conservation, landscape design, horticulture, floral design, or all around excellence. Any member of a State Garden Club, who has never been a member of NGC Board of Directors, including State Presidents is eligible. Do not use VFGC/NGC cover sheet/application form. Submit a Book of Evidence of no more than 5 pages (one side only) to District Awards Chairman by

December 1st. For more information see the VFGC Awards webpage. Only one nominee allowed per district. Overall winner will be submitted to South Atlantic Region to compete for the Member Award of Honor. (NGC# SR-4)
