The funds are used to support community projects, including scholarships for Nature Camp, a nationally recognized summer camp Vesuvius Virginia. NBGC took in a record amount of money!

Said Maureen Becker, club second vice president and exhibits chair, "There are two reasons why we do this: the plant sale is an engine for fundraising, and it makes people "really happy."









## The Rapid Ann Garden Club

Rapid Ann Garden Club visited White Oak Lavender Farm in Harrisonburg, Virginia on June 11, 2025. The owner, Julie Haushalter, gave us a 90-minute tour, barely enough time to cover everything going on at this extraordinary agri-tourist destination. There are fields of lavender, lovely gardens, a gift shop, a petting zoo, alpacas, a music stage, an education building, and other venues. The farm is an official Monarch way station. A brewer/vintner and a beekeeper are on staff.

Picking your own lavender is included in the tour. The scent of fresh lavender is intriguingly aromatic, refreshing, and relaxing.

The Haushalters process the lavender buds in their own still and make over 100 productions right there on the farm. They sell everything from essential oils to tinctures, creams, dry rubs, lavender for cooking, and lavender honey. They also sell wine and garden-related items.

Lavender plants thrive with poor soil, good drainage, and full sun – at least 6 hours a day. Deer don't eat them! English lavender generally survives Virginia winters and lasts about 10-15 years. Lavender is a woody shrub that is a member of the mint family. Trim it for more blooms and prune it in the fall.

Everyone enjoyed the tour tremendously, learned a lot about lavender, and got a head start on Christmas shopping at the glorious gift shop!







## Are you planning a Flower Show?

What a wonderful event flower shows are for your members, clubs and the community. Whether you are having a small, standard, holiday or specialty show, consider applying for the NGC Flower Show Achievement Award. All that applied last year won an NGC Award...that speaks volumes for the quality of VFGC flower shows.

If you are considering applying for an Award, your schedule needs to be reviewed. In fact, all schedules should be reviewed. We all learn from this process. Three judges will be selected from your judging panels...they will review the show/evaluate and tell you if you are able to work on the Book of Evidence, in other words the show scored 95 or greater.

Book of Evidence – Information on preparing a Book of Evidence for a Flower Show Achievement Award, including format and deadlines (**VFGC Book of Evidences must be in by January 1**), can be found on the NGC Website. The Book of Evidence must be submitted electronically to the VFGC Flower Show Evaluation Chairman.

The following forms must be included with the Book of Evidence. a. b. NGC Flower Show Achievement Award Application Form (fillable PDF) NGC Flower Show Achievement Award Show Data Form (fillable PDF). There is a sample of a Book of Evidence on the NGC web under Flower Show School forms and information and in the Awards Section...under the circle, type awards: this will bring up a wealth of information.

We already have 4 schedules applying for an NGC Award, and there are at least two others in the works.

Send your schedules for review....by email!! And most importantly keep having flower shows...any size club can have a show.

Handbook for Flower Shows, 2017 Edition, NGC Exhibiting & Judging, both available on the NGC Website for purchase or download of Handbook.

**Flower Show Procedure** will cover an introduction to the *Handbook*, flower show composition, definition, purposes, and basic requirements of all standard flower shows, types of flower shows, standard system of judging, explanation of non-Top Exhibitor Awards, and an overview of the Flower Show Schedule.

**Horticulture** will cover plant nomenclature, entry tags, general requirements for NGC Horticulture Top Exhibitor Awards, explanation of judging qualities found on the horticulture point scoring form, horticulture commenting vocabulary, judging procedures, & discussion of two types of horticulture & practice point scoring of them.

**Design** will include a brief history of floral design, emphasis on the elements & principles of design, general requirements for NGC Design Top Exhibitor Awards, explanation of judging qualities found on the Design Point Scoring form, design commenting vocabulary, judging procedure, and practice point scoring of two types of traditional designs.
